Further Information

Standing Order v Envelope Donations

The administration of regular Standing Order giving is much simpler for us than the administration of the equivalent donations using the envelopes. If you give regularly using the donation envelopes, perhaps you would consider switching to Standing Order. If you have internet banking, you can set up and manage a Standing Order to St Swithun's PCC yourself. If not, please use the paper Standing Order form and give it to your bank or return it to the Stewardship Secretary to send to your bank.

Yellow Gift Aid Donation Envelopes

If you contribute with cash on the collection plate and you are a UK tax payer, you can use the Yellow Gift Aid envelopes for these contributions. The envelopes are on the shelf by the first pillar on the left as you enter the church.

Gift Aid on Cash Donations

We are able to claim Gift Aid on anonymous donations of £20 or less. This includes cash given on the collection plate during the services and other anonymous cash donations given when the collection is for St Swithun's.

Notes on Gift Aid Declaration

Please notify the Stewardship Secretary if you:

Want to cancel this declaration

Change your name or home address

No longer pay sufficient tax on your income and/or capital gains. Gift Aid is linked to basic rate tax.

Basic rate tax is currently 20%, which allows charities to reclaim 25p in the pound. Higher rate taxpayers can claim back the difference between basic rate and higher rate or additional rate tax. If you pay Income Tax at the higher or additional rate and want to receive the additional tax relief due to you, you must include all your Gift Aid donations on your Self Assessment tax return or ask HM Revenue and Customs to adjust your tax code.

Information Privacy Notice

The stewardship forms and a record of your donations are retained by the Stewardship Secretary in confidence, separately from other personal information held by St Swithun's and are only used for stewardship administration.

Details of "Gift Aided" donations are sent electronically to HM Revenue and Customs as part of this administration and there is a legal requirement to retain this information for a period of 7 years.
